Announcing the winner of the 2023 New England Writers' Centre Fellowship

In partnership with Varuna, The National Writers' House, the New England Writers' Centre is delighted to announce Matthew Tighe as the winner of the 2023 Varuna-New England Writers' Centre Fellowship.

The Fellowship, to be taken up in 2024, will give Matt a week's inspirational writing residency in the beautiful surroundings of Varuna, in the Blue Mountains. It includes full board and accommodation at Varuna, funds towards travel, a one-on-one consultation with a Varuna expert and more.

This is the fifth year of the Fellowship. The inaugural year, in 2019, was supported by a generous grant from the Copyright Agency.

Chosen by Varuna's team from a shortlist previously selected by judges from the New England Writers' Centre, Matt's winning submission included an extract from his steampunk/police procedural manuscript *Trilby and the Case of the Brittlebury Bottle*, which he will be working on during his residency. Matt's submission was praised by the judges as "Unique and engaging! Highly readable."

Varuna's Executive Director, Veechi Stuart, said: "We loved the freshness, quirk and originality of Matthew's submission. Congratulations Matt! We look forward to seeing you for your residency in 2024."


